of Pastor Mark*

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

For March we continue our walk through Lent and come to our celebration of Easter on the very last day of the month. In addition to the noon midweek services on March 6th and March 20th at Holy Trinity, you are invited to noon worship at First United Lutheran in Kennesaw on March 13th and to our annual Celtic service here at Holy Trinity the evening of March 13th at 7:30 pm.

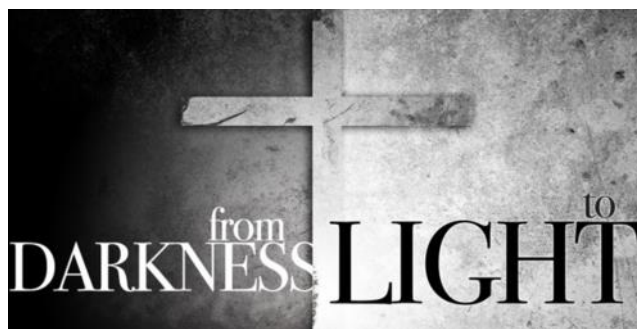
March 24th marks our transition to Holy Week, as we celebrate Palm Sunday with palms lifted high and with shouts of hosanna. The shouts will shift however, as Jesus goes from his triumphal entry into Jerusalem and transitions his journey toward the cross. Soon enough, there are shouts of "Crucify him!" Remembering the rejection of Christ, his human mortality in the midst of his divinity, and our place and sin in all this, we move to Maundy Thursday for a last supper together, and then to Good Friday. Behind the scenes, did you know that we intentionally keep some of our palms from Palm Sunday and burn them once they've dried? The ashes are then mixed together for Ash Wednesday. So when we began Lent on February 14th this Ash Wednesday, our ashes for worship came from palms in last year's Palm Sunday service here at Holy Trinity.

Also, this year for Maundy Thursday in our celebration of Holy Communion, we plan to place the rails around the altar and gather together encircled at the altar, mindful of the gathering together of Jesus and his disciples at the table in the upper room for the last supper together. Good Friday will be our Tenebrae service of shadows, remembering the seven last words of Christ and the darkness and despair of the cross. It's a moving service that prepares our hearts to truly celebrate Easter as we move from Vigil to Easter in our March 30th Saturday worship and celebrate with fanfare Easter morning on March 31st.

Come worship at Holy Trinity this Lent and Holy Week, going deeper and moving closer to our Lord, mindful of the cross, both as an instrument of death on Good Friday, and as the instrument of resurrection, love, and life everlasting that it has become through the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. If you're unable to be here in person, be a part of worship online, as we are one body of Christ together. See you at church and in worship, as we walk together by faith.

Please feel free to contact me if you have any questions or comments.



Stewardship



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Grace and peace to you in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. An early Lenten season is upon us. It seems like only yesterday we were talking about our Christmas gifts to the Lord. Traditionally, Lent is a time of prayer and reflection. It can also be a time focused on sacrifice, culminating with Jesus' death on the cross. We read in scripture this season about Jesus' baptism and trials in the wilderness, which prepared him for the path to come. We also hear in two of the gospel readings about dying to our earthly selves so that we may have eternal life. From the gospel of Mark (8:34-38):

Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up the cross and follow me. For whoever wants to save their life will lose it, but whoever loses their life for me and for the gospel will save it. What good is it for someone to gain the whole world, yet forfeit their soul.

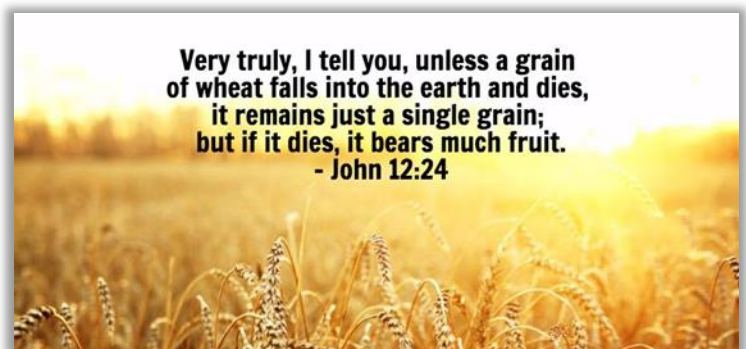
While sacrificial giving is an important principle in Christian stewardship, and a practice we are called to live, it can be a narrow interpretation of stewardship. Instead this Lenten season I would encourage us all to broaden our perspective of what good stewardship means beyond our monetary gifts. In doing so, I like to focus on the gift of grace given through Jesus' death and resurrection that we celebrate on Easter. How do we respond to such selfless generosity? By being generous ourselves. During your own prayer and reflection this season, think about your gifts: your skills, your time, and your possessions. Are you being a good steward of all that has been given to you? Are you using your gifts to their maximum effect in a way the Lord intends?

Holy Trinity is a congregation abounding with opportunities and community ministries where your gifts can be put to good use. A great way to give of your time, and a personal favorite of mine, is Habitat For Humanity. Work will be ongoing most Saturdays through June 1st in partnership with the Lutheran Coalition. Another focus during Lent is our appeal for the Appalachian Water Project. A worthy cause for your gifts of wealth that will help those most in need in our society who lack even basic access to clean water. And, as always, your giving to the Church is appreciated and continues to support our many ministries.

The Lutheran Coalition for Habitat will be assigned several slots over many Saturdays for this build. We need volunteers. No real experience is necessary. I am sure most of us can swing a hammer and pound a nail. Or, use a paint brush and paint roller. If you like to plant bushes or do landscaping, those skills are also needed.

On March 16, Holy Trinity Lutheran Church will begin helping to build a Habitat for Humanity house. The house will be for a community servant such as a teacher or bus driver. Work days will be Saturdays from 7:45 am to 4:00 pm. Volunteers should bring their own lunches. Below are the activities for each work week:

March 16 - Exterior Walls: build and raise exterior walls

March 23 - Interior Walls: build and raise interior walls

April 6 - Siding & Insulation: install the siding and insulation

April 20 - Exterior Paint: paint the exterior walls, trim, and shutters

April 27 - Interior Paint Prep: prepare the walls for paint

May 4 - Interior Paint: first coat of paint

May 11 - Interior Paint & Trim: second coat of paint

May 18 - Complete the House: install hardware and complete the final touches

June 1 - Landscaping: lay sod, plant shrubs, and install the mailbox

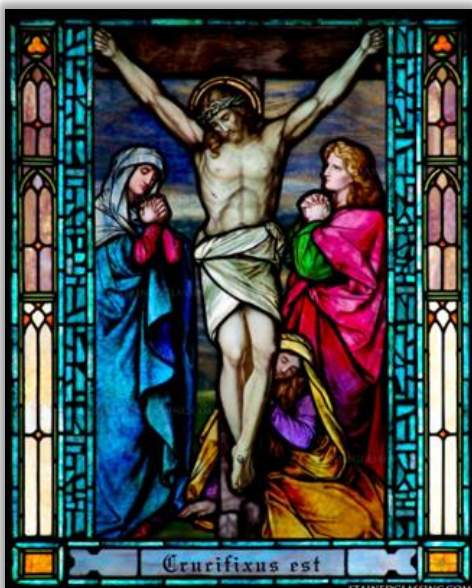

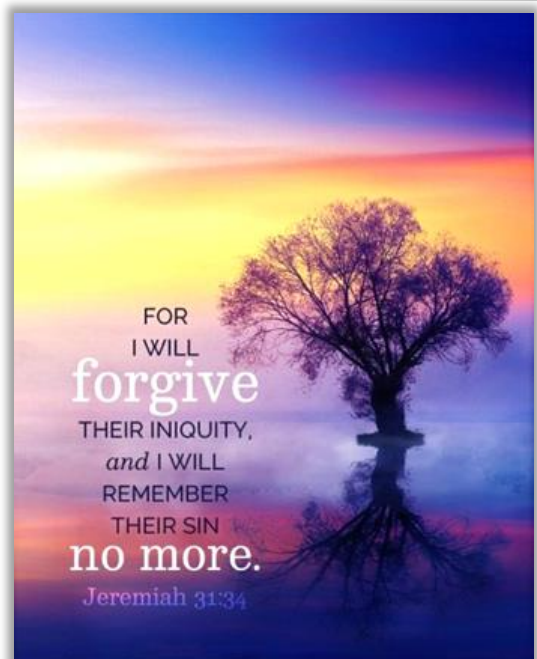

Always be on the lookout for fake calls, texts, emails, websites, messages on social media and letters in the mail. Please be hyper aware and cautious as there are many examples of scammers appearing to be someone else. Never take any requests for money and/or personal information at face value. Don't share personal information, send money and/or gift cards without thoroughly checking out who is truly asking for this information. Even if the person who appears to be someone you know well or are close to, make sure the request is truly coming from that person. Scammers will disguise their true email addresses/phone numbers to make you think it is coming from a person you know. Always err on side of caution and call your acquaintance up and check with them. It may seem strange but it can save you a lot of grief and with so many scams these days, they are sure to understand. If you do find that you have received a scam request, block the email or phone number so they can't send to you again and report to the appropriate authorities.
